## **PART I: THE PRIORITY AND CONTEXT OF VISION**

**SCRIPTURE:** NEHEMIAH 1:3-4; HABAKKUK 2:2-4

### **key theme**

What is vision and why is it important for our lives?

- 1) Vision is a clear and compelling strategic understanding of God's purposes that allows us to focus our time, energy, and talents.
- 2) Vision gives us hope, passion + a call to remain steadfast.
- 3) While we may be inspired with ideas, true vision comes from God's sharing in the plans that he has for us.
- 4) Vision starts with what does God say about a situation / circumstance / relationship / responsibility / need?
- 5) Our challenge is to ask God not only for vision, but an understanding of how the vision intersects.
  - a. Every vision is for an appointed time, so if you have a picture of what God desires but not God's priority, then you don't truly have the picture that God has for you.

- 1) What has God already revealed in the scriptures regarding the vision for your life and your responsibilities?
- 2) How can you prioritize the various stages of multiple visions?
- 3) How can you authenticate a God idea vs. a good idea?
